## Ki malakhey yetzaveh lach, lishmorkha b'chol d'rakhekha.

May angels be appointed for (him/her/their), to guard (him/her/their) on all (his/her/their) paths.

In Your hand lies (his/her/their) spirit. In Your Great Name, You hold the life and memories of each soul on earth. You redeem us, Adonai, God of Truth.
